BIOGRAPHY

Sirawit Chatu (2000, Rayong, Thailand) is a multidisciplinary artist and an independent curator. His artworks are based on Thai culture, traditional art, religion, folklore and oral history, juxtaposed with elements from popular culture and the internet. Sirawit's practice includes various media of art, such as; painting, printmaking, sculpture, installation, video, performance and so on. His art sheds light on the complexities and contradictions inherent in Thai traditions, offering a fresh perspective on societal norms, in order to humorously criticize contemporary issues. Since the age of twelve, he has been featured in over 30 exhibitions, domestic and overseas.

In 2022, Sirawit received a scholarship to study Japanese painting at Joshibi University, Japan. During this time, he established an alternative art space in Kanagawa and began his curatorial practice. *Ryo Art Space Collaborative Project* showcased 4 exhibitions featuring international artists from Thailand, Japan, China, and the United Kingdom.

His current body of work is set around Thai beliefs and spiritual practices that are hidden within the capitalist system. Sirawit's solo exhibitions, *Endless Prayer* in 2023 and *Re-enchanted* in 2024, delve into the intricate relationship between capitalism and spirituality, highlighting how economic factors have become intertwined with religious practices. His artworks shed light on how local myths and traditional beliefs are commodified and exploited within this context. Through the incorporation of the media, the exhibitions showcase how these capitalist influences perpetuate an endless cycle of prayer and devotion.






























ACCUMULATE, ACCUMULATE No.1 Acrylic on Nang-kwak Talisman 120x210 cm.








Holy Designer 2023 Acrylic on Thai Talisman Vest



This project mainly focuses on the systematic inquiry of art institutions such as galleries and museums by creating overlaps between privacy and publicness, questions the traditional aesthetic of art space, and encourages artists to express themselves without capitalistic conditions.






































Under Construction: Where Do We Go From Now?

The 15-minute video shows the construction of a road in a city. A lot of foreign workers are building a city that is not their territory. The sound of metal clashing echoed throughout the area. Beneath the noise of the construction, there was an unfamiliar sound of spoken language intermittently. together with the music from the radio that sings in the same language as that voice It looks like a stage play with workers as performers. They jumped and danced to the rhythm of the machines. If this is a musical or a live performance by an artist.

The next screen showed a laborer sitting with her back to the audience, dressed in sweat from all day's hard work. She sat motionless, staring out the window as if watching something. It could be the scenery, the atmosphere, the people, or the performance, but the window was completely closed.
